- The success of **community-focused programs**, including Stand Down events, mental health summits, and local advocacy initiatives.

The report also evaluates county-level efforts through the **Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Plans**, highlighting best practices from Los Angeles, San Diego, and Santa Cruz Counties, while identifying gaps in veteran-specific programming across other regions.

CAVSA's 2024 Annual Report celebrates the remarkable contributions of its retiring founding members and Executive Director. It also highlights the organization's 2025 advocacy priorities, including expanding housing access, improving mental health care, and bolstering substance abuse prevention programs.
